#### 1. Frontline Education

# a) <u>Approval of Award RFP/Q for Lease-Leaseback Construction Services for the West Point</u> <u>Elementary School (WPE) HVAC & Modernization Project</u>

As of January 1, 2017, AB 2316 requires school districts to use a comprehensive "best value" selection process for lease-leaseback contracts. Districts are required to advertise a request for proposals, receive sealed proposals from prequalified contractors, and rank those proposals using the best value scoring method.

Consistent with AB 2316, the District sought proposals from prequalified contractors with a request for proposals. One proposal was received and reviewed in accordance with the best value scoring method identified in the request for proposals on December 10, 2021, at 3:00 PM.

Carter Kelly Inc. - \$1,395,616.00 S&B James - Attended Job Walk - No proposal submitted Swinerton - Attended Job Walk - No proposal submitted

Based on the best value rate of 255 points, Carter Kelly Inc. was recommended for approval by the CUSD Board of Trustees to complete the West Point Elementary School HVAC & Modernization Project at the cost of \$1,395,616.00 (cost includes a \$100,000 contingency However, the cost does not include the generator as CUSD will purchase separately to avoid overhead). The cost of the generator is \$151,800.00.

Upon award of the lease-leaseback agreement, Carter Kelly Inc. will begin performing construction services.

Board approval was requested to award the RFP/Q for Lease-Leaseback Construction Services for the WPE HVAC & Modernization project to Carter Kelly Inc.
